<u>Mass in St. Mary's Church, Cloone</u>: Thanks to those who helped to prepare the Church for Masses at the weekend and to those who did stewarding and cleaning.

In order to continue having two Masses in Cloone, we need more volunteers for stewarding at the Masses. Please contact any member of the Pastoral Council, if you can help. It is not necessary to book Mass in Cloone. We can accommodate 50 people in Cloone Church.

There are now three speakers outside the Church which will enable people to hear Mass in the Church yard or in their cars.

Cloone Church will open at 7.30 pm for 8.00 pm Mass on Saturday's and at 9.30 pm for 10.00 am Mass on Sunday's.

Aughavas Mass on Sunday July 19th

- While social distancing still applies to the seating positions in the St. Joseph's church, we can now accommodate families so long as family members sit together.
- We have decided to discontinue the booking system.
- We are in the process of improving the sound quality of the outside speakers.

- We are appealing for more volunteers to assist with cleaning and stewarding at each Sunday Mass. We intend to setup a rota to limit the demands on those who volunteer.

Funerals: Funerals in Cloone and Aughavas will not be held on Sundays for the duration of the Covid 19 pandemic.

First Friday Visits for the Parishes of Cloone and Aughavas: First Friday visits to the housebound will resume in August. First Friday visits will take place when the parishioner invites the Priest to call. Fr. Tiernan will not call to any housebound person unless that person or a family member asks him to call.

Community Connect (*linking parents to real support*): Many women experiencing unexpected pregnancies struggle with the nagging question: how will I provide for my baby? Community Connect exists to help answer this question with practical, material support, so that mums and parents feel more secure and supported in bringing their baby into the world. Community Connect has a very precise mission. It is not a counselling service, but operates as a practical support hub where parents in need can access items like nappies and wipes, as well as pre-loved items such as babygros, outfits, blankets, buggies and other practical aids. Community Connect initially has six volunteer-run locations operating across the country, where people can donate baby items and parents in need can access them. The hubs are located in Dublin (North and South), Galway, Limerick, Athlone and Cork.
