THE SEASON OF CREATION, 1st September - 4th October 2021: The one phrase from Laudato Si' which I have been alert to for some time is "We are not God" (LS,67). Pope Francis is highlighting that our calling to stewardship of the Earth has been misinterpreted as a licence to exercise domination over all other life forms. He reminds us that our preoccupation with absolute ownership runs counter to God's gift of creation. He advocates a relationship whereby we take just enough to subsist and so provide for future generations (LS.67).

We are in a relationship of interdependency with all of life. It means that we cannot see plant and animal life as just mere resources (LS,33). Once we come to an appreciation of different species, we must take practical steps to ensure their survival so that each creature can give glory to God.

In the Season of Creation, we want to celebrate, firstly, the beauty and diversity of all of creation which has been or is on display at this time of year and secondly, its fruitfulness as we move towards harvest time. The whole of creation is speaking to us of God, revealing God as do the scriptures in the Word of God. What is the Word of God of this Sunday saying that is relevant to the celebration of the Season of Creation? When we consider ourselves as part of the interrelationship of creation, we are challenged to move beyond notions of individual salvation alone. I am drawn to reflect upon the invitation of Jesus in our Gospel of this Sunday to 'renounce oneself and take up one's cross and follow Him". In the context of an interdependent relationship with all of creation we are called to renounce the tendency to be those independent individuals who in being self-centred give rise to a collective selfishness. National Heritage Week 2021: To celebrate National Heritage Week 2021, Mary Conefrey, Local Studies Librarian at Leitrim County Library explores the Heritage of her home townland of Lisgillock Glebe using Online Resources. This can be used as template for researching other areas of the Parish, County or Country. Sources used are townlands.ie, 1901 and 1911 Census of Population, Griffiths Valuation, heritagemaps ie and images of archaeological structures in the townland captured by means of a drone. Log on to www.heritageweek.ie and select Projects 2021, enter Lisgillock in the Keyword box to search and click on Watch on YouTube for each of the six short videos.

Leitrim County Council - Hedge Cutting Grant Scheme 2021/2022: This scheme aims to encourage the cutting of roadside hedges /trees along the public road network. Please note that it is the responsibility of landowners/property owners to cut roadside hedges/trees which are on their property and which are along the public road network. The Grant is €75 per km of roadside hedge/overhanging trees which are cut back. The minimum length of roadside hedges to be cut is 1km per application.
