Norms for indulgences at the Commemoration of All Souls.

- 1. From twelve o'clock noon on 1st November until midnight on 2nd November, all who have confessed, received Holy Communion and prayed for the pope's intentions (one Our Father and Hail Mary, or any other prayer of one's choice) can gain one plenary indulgence by visiting a church or oratory, and there reciting one Our Father and the Apostle's Creed. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls of all the departed. Confessions may be made at any time within the week preceding or the week following 1st November.
- 2. The faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the dead may gain a plenary indulgence applicable only to the Holy Souls on the usual conditions once per day from 1st to 8th November. The conditions mentioned above apply also for this.

A Mass for the deceased Members and Staff of Leitrim County Council will be held in St. Mary's Church, Carrick-on-Shannon on Monday 1st November 2021 at 8.00 pm.

Guidelines for Religious Services for Cloone & Aughavas: Fr. Peter and the members of both Pastoral Councils have reviewed the guidelines for religious services. We have taken into account the letter from Bishop Francis in which he stated that " it is important that we take a cautious approach to further reopening" and that we should bear in mind "the continuing requirement for social distancing". We have also listened to the views of the small number of Mass-goers who made contact with us.

The following restrictions and practices will remain in place in both parishes for the moment:

- (1) We appeal to all those attending church services to wear face coverings/masks, sanitise hands and maintain social distancing. These simple measures help to protect all of us.
- (2) Seats will continue to be cordoned off with ties.
- (3) Communion will be given on the hand, and at each seat.
- (4) General sanitising of the churches will continue before and after services.
- (5) There will be no anniversary/month's mind Masses at weekends.
- (6) Anyone who has covid-type symptoms should stay away from church services. In both parishes, we are now encouraging people to stand, kneel or sit at the appropriate times during Mass. On a trial basis, we will set aside the practice of having stewards at doors we trust that Mass-goers will respect all guidelines without the need for stewarding (to be reviewed as necessary). Those who were stewarding in Cloone Church are asked to please remove the ropes from the seats for Holy Communion, to sanitise the seats after Mass and to replace the ropes. In the absence of stewards, collection baskets will be moved to convenient access points inside the church doors, but will not be passed around. At this time, when Covid cases are still high and when many are seriously ill in our hospitals, we feel that caution is the best course to follow.
