AUGHAVAS PUBLIC MEETING - HELPING UKRAINE: An approach was made recently to Fr. Tiernan with a view to having Aughavas parish house made available to accommodate refugees from Ukraine. Fr Peter and the Pastoral Council have agreed in principle that the house can be made available if we can get the community support that will be necessary to do the remedial and preparatory works. While there is no major structural work involved, it will need a lot of cleaning and tidying up, along with provision of the furniture and fittings for basic daily living.

So we are holding a public meeting in Aughavas Community Centre on Thursday night, 7th April at 8 30pm. We are calling on anyone and everyone who can offer voluntary help in whatever way to advance this project, whether you have a specialised skill or you are just willing to help with cleaning and preparing rooms. Some organisations and individuals have already offered voluntary labour and financial support - to these we are very grateful. We hope to set up a small committee on Thursday night to coordinate the work. The project will not involve a long-term commitment - just a few weeks of good honest teamwork. If you think you can help even in what seems a small way, or if you have any views on this matter, please come to the public meeting. This is a special opportunity for us as a local community to do something very practical to show our solidarity with the suffering people of Ukraine.

Pope warns against digital media addiction in Lenten message: The Pope recommended that Lent 2022 can be a time to put down the smartphone and encounter those in need face to face.

"Let us not grow tired of fighting against concupiscence, that weakness which induces to selfishness and all evil, and finds in the course of history a variety of ways to lure men and women into sin," Pope Francis said in the message published February

"One of these is addiction to the digital media, which impoverishes human relationships. Lent is a propitious time to resist these temptations and to cultivate instead a more integral form of human communication made up of 'authentic encounters,' face to face and in person".

"Let us not grow tired of uprooting evil from our lives. May the corporal fasting to which Lent calls us fortify our spirit for the battle against sin," Pope Francis said. "Let us not grow tired of asking for forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation, knowing that God never tires of forgiving."
